THE SECRETARY - GENERAL'S UN DAY MESSAGE

A quarter-century has passed since the leaders of a tired and bleeding world put their signatures to a document born of the agony and anguish of war. The Charter of the United Nations, which came to life in one of history's most momentous ceremonies, held out the promise of a world with peace, prosperity and freedom to be attained through equal rights for men and women and for nations, large and small, old and new.

The United Nations born of the Charter has done well, but it has not done well enough. In a sense, it is a great parliament of mankind to which evils, injustice and the aspirations of man are being brought; it has helped to prevent local conflicts from turning into world-wide conflagrations; it has assisted 1,000 million people to gain their independence; it has proclaimed the inalienable rights of the human person; it has revealed and helped to heal the great economic and social inequalities that prevail on Earth; it has condemned and fought colonialism, discrimination and racism in all its forms; it has defended the dignity of man and the integ-



...rity of our environment; and it has looked far into the future, warning nations and

men of world-wide dangers ahead.

But the United Nations has not done well enough. It is unforgivable that so many problems from the past are still with us, absorbing vast energies and resources desperately needed for nobler purposes: a horrid and futile armaments race instead of world development; remnants of colonialism, racism and violations of human rights instead of freedom and brotherhood; dreams of power and domination instead of fraternal co-existence; exclusion of great human communities from world co-operation instead of universality; extension of ideological domains instead of mutual enrichment in the art of governing men to make the world safe for diversity; local conflicts instead of neighbourly co-operation.

While these antiquated concepts and attitudes persist, the rapid pace of change around us breeds new problems which cry for the world's collective attention and care: the increasing discrepancy between rich and poor nations; the scientific and technological gap; the population explosion; the deterioration of the environment; the urban proliferation; the drug problem; the alienation

The United Nations has prepared a great spectacle of events to commemorate the twenty-fifth anniversary of its foundation during a special session from October 14 to 24.

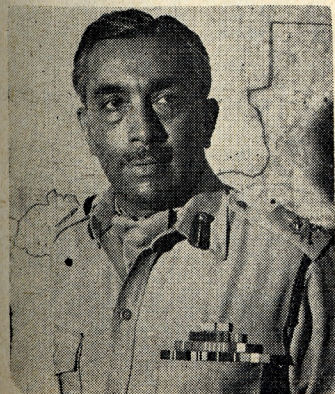
In this anniversary year, 127 Member States have been asked to mark the celebration by proposing ways of strengthening the Organization's peace-keeping machinery.

I venture to forecast that this declaration will be unanimously approved

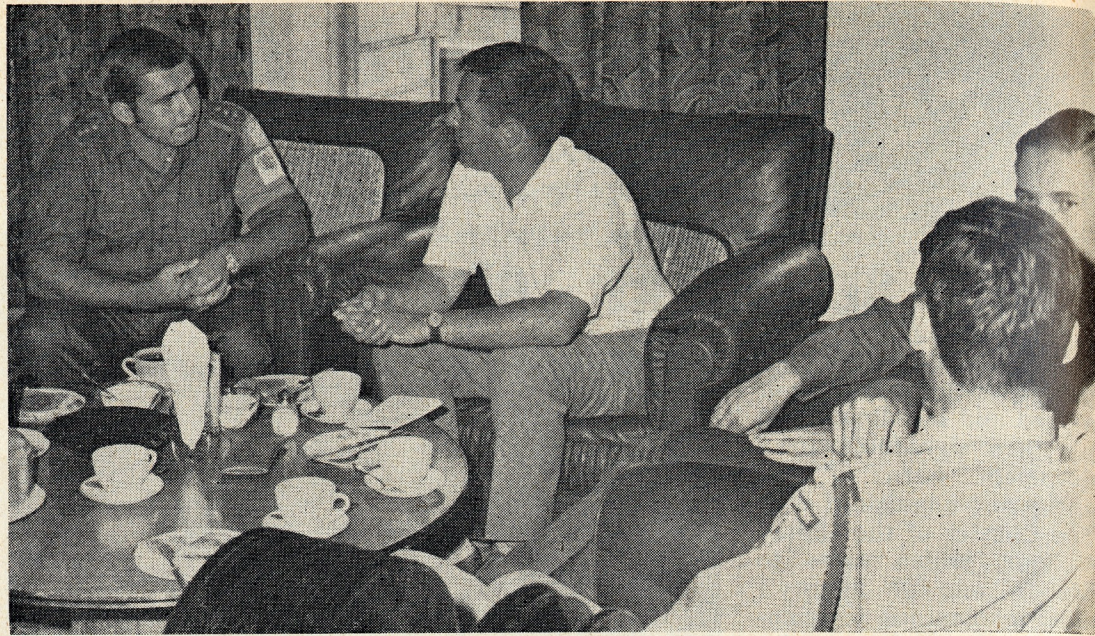
and that it will establish a landmark in promoting the rule of law among nations and particularly the universal application of the principles embodied in the Charter of San Francisco.

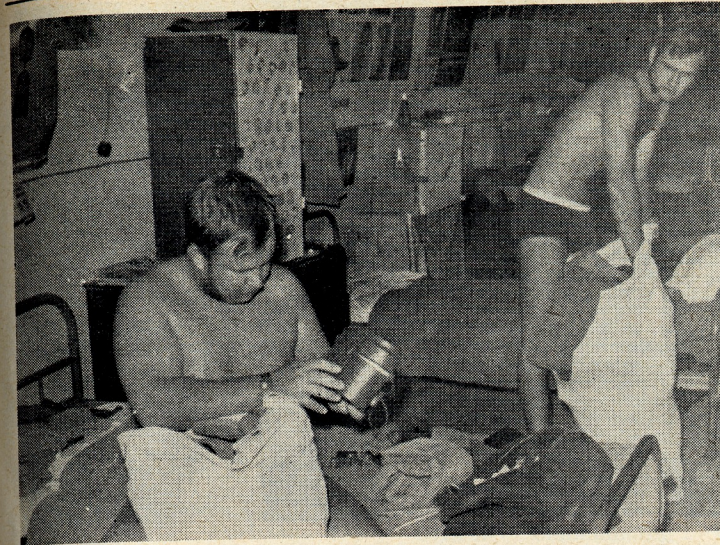

GREEN JACKETS SET FOOT IN CYPRUS

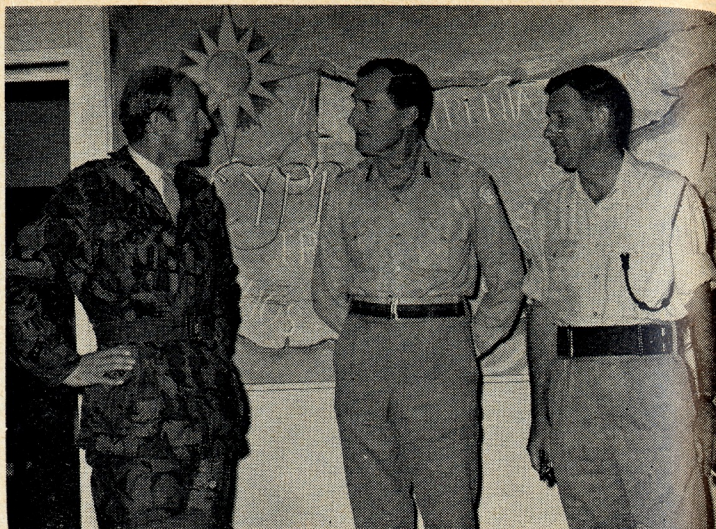

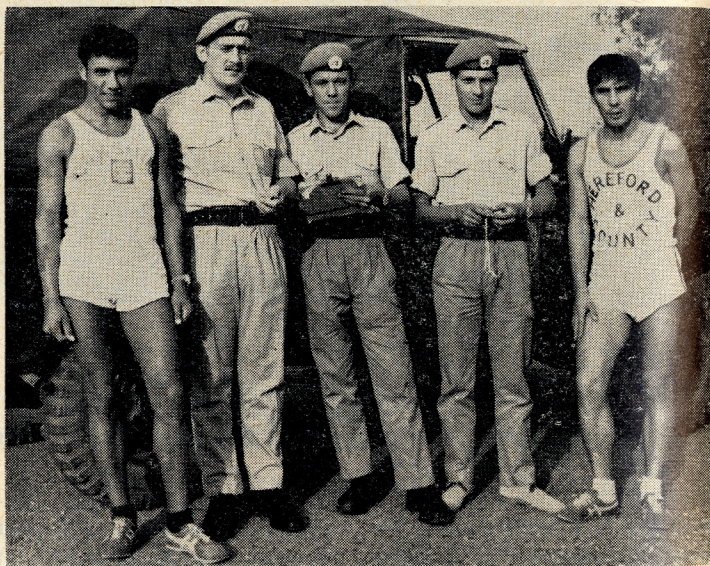

On 27th September 1970 Private Loveridge broke the existing record of 1 hr 39 mins for the road run from Stavrokono to St Barbaras, Paphos. His time was 1 hr 35 mins. Lance Corporal Edwards later bettered this time with a record run of 1 hr 29 mins 44 secs.

and down of 9 miles a record time of 56 mins. Lance Corporal Edwards fastest time up on 5.7 mile course each way was 30 mins 12 secs and for twice up and twice down (a distance of 22.8 miles) a time of 2 hrs 23 mins 36 secs.

On 4th October the two runners attempted two different routes from the Nicosia road junction to Stavrovouni Monastery. Private Loveridge taking the shorter steeper route set a record for the 4 1/2 miles up at 35 mins and for the total once up

On 10th October 1970 both athletes attempted the distance of 9.4 miles from Troodhitissa Monastery to Mount Olympus in the Troodos Mountains. Lance Corporal Edwards set the record at 1 hr 6 mins 5 secs closely followed by Private Loveridge in 1 hr 9 mins 59 secs.

MINISTER FOR DEFENCE VISITS IRCON

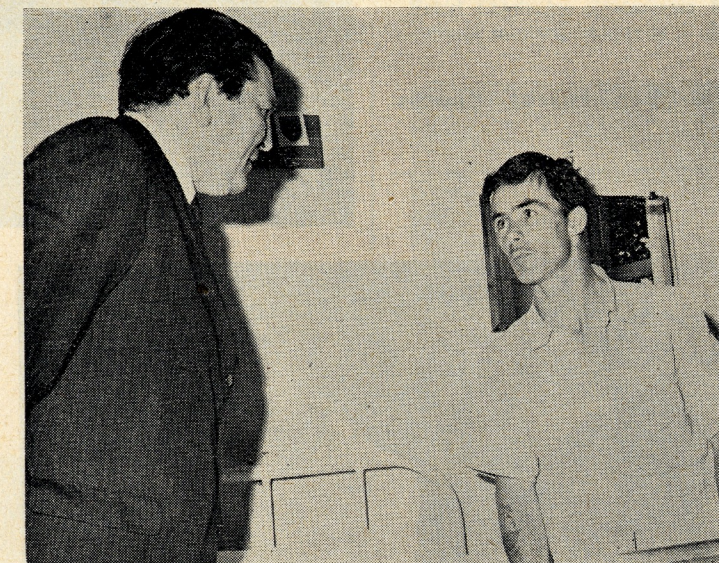

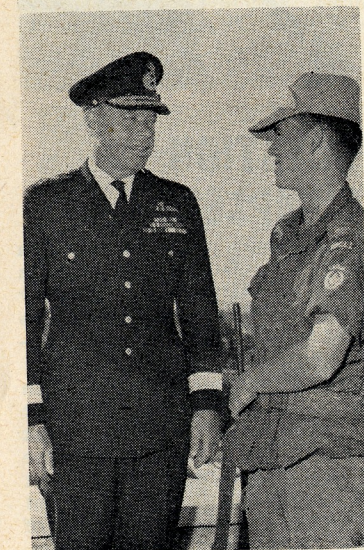

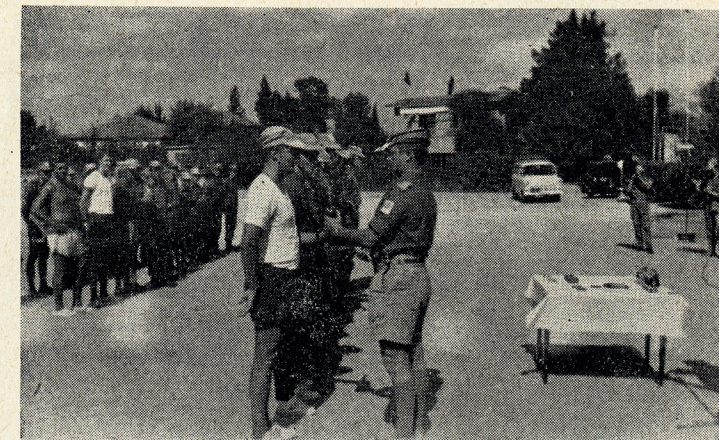

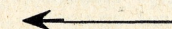

KIRKKOON PERJANTAINA

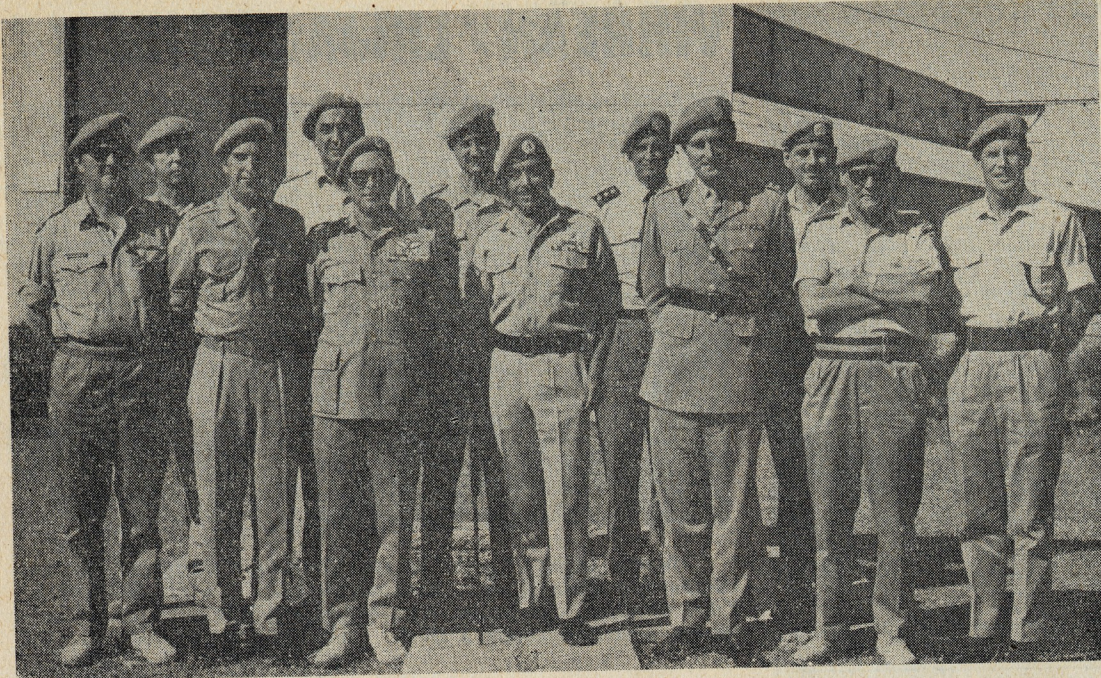

of youth; the excessive consumption of resources by insatiable societies and institutions. The very survival of a civilised and humane society seems to be at stake.

The world is bursting out of its narrow political vestments. The behaviour of many nations is certainly inadequate to meet the new challenges of our small and rapidly changing planet. International co-operation is lagging considerably. The United Nations, this hesitant, almost reluctant instrument of nations for world peace and unity, can only succeed if its constituent members support it, love it, give it their best and want it to succeed. It will fail if Governments scoff at it and continue to tread their isolated, divisive and selfish paths.

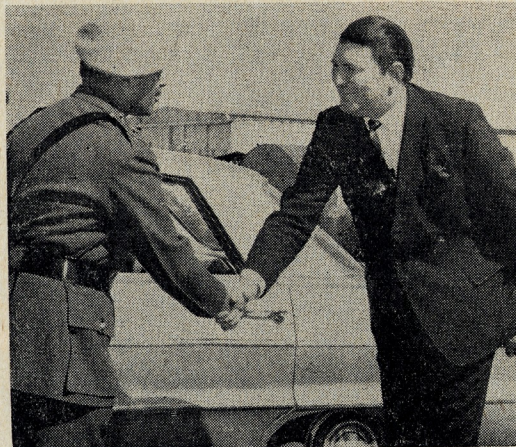
Is it not high time for the leaders of this world to turn radically away from the errors of the past and to realize that understanding, love and tolerance are highest forms of interest on our small and inter-dependent planet? That any wound of this Earth is a wound of the body as a whole? That parochial policies are self-defeating and self-destroying? Is this not what our youth is trying so desperately, though not so cogently, to tell us?

Squalid poverty lives side by side with over-abundance on our Earth. We have reached the Moon but we have not yet reached each other. Many species of our co-inhabitants on the globe from the bird and animal world have forever disappeared. Many beautiful rivers have become sewers endangering the oceans. We

must heed the omens. It is time for Governments to make a fresh start and to lift themselves again to the same high level, if not a higher level, of vision and determination as that of the authors of the Charter. We must give the

Charter a real chance at last. We must pass from words to deeds. We must pass from rights to obligations. We must pass from self interest to mutual interest. We must pass from partial peace to total peace.

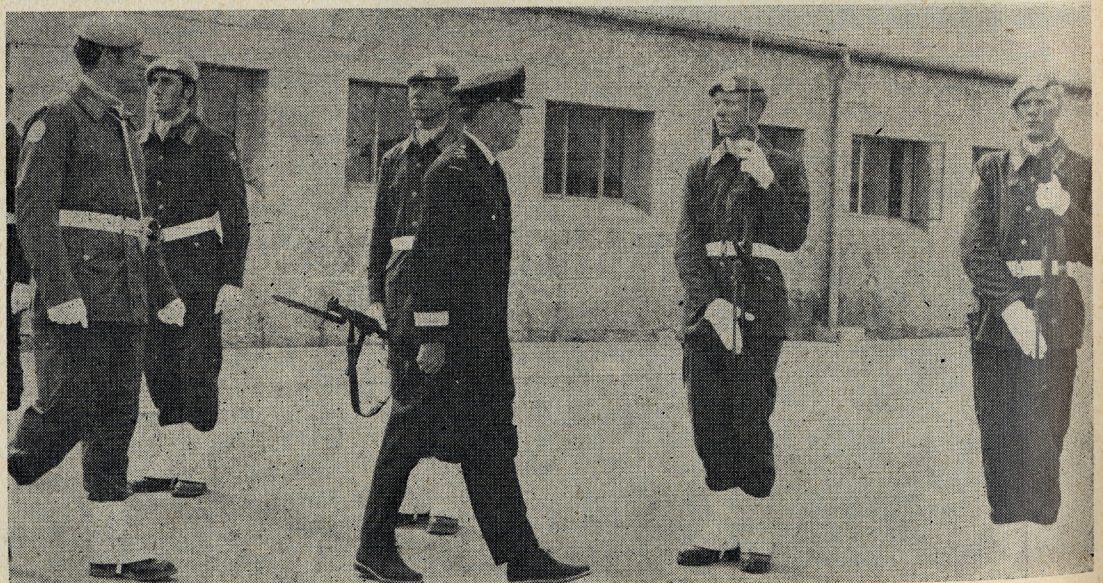
